Fremont Public Schools Launch Pre-School Programs

With help from the Fremont Area Community Foundation and the Fremont Public School Foundation, the Fremont Public Schools launched pre-school programs in three of its highest poverty schools last fall. Three and four year olds now have the opportunity to attend half-day programs at Washington, Linden and Milliken Park Schools, where they engage in a program focused on increasing skills needed for success in kindergarten. Brad Dahl, FPS Director of FPS student services, noted that both academic and socialization skills are stressed as a means of helping prepare students for full-time kindergarten. The addition of the programs nearly doubles the capacity of Fremont Public Schools to provide pre-school programs. Previously, pre-school services were offered only for children with identified disabilities at Davenport School.

The program was made possible through a grant from the State Department of Education, and was supported with additional funding from the Fremont Community Foundation and the Fremont Public School Foundation. Three full-time early childhood teachers have been

New Welding Facility Already Paying Dividends for Students

The state-of-the-art welding lab that opened at Fremont High School last fall is already paying huge dividends for FHS students. Fremont High seniors Ethan Dannelly and Nathan Houser, and junior Hunter Gustafson qualified for the national competition by finishing in first place in the welding fabrication competition at the SkillsUSA Nebraska State Leadership and Skills Conference April 15-17 at the CenturyLink Center in Omaha. They will represent the state of Nebraska at the SkillsUSA national competition June 22-26 in Louisville, Ky. All three students learned their skills in Fremont High School's new welding program, and they plan to complete a degree in welding beyond high school.

Talk of a partnership that would train high school students for a rewarding career while providing local industry with the skilled workers it needs carried on for nearly seven years, but when Fremont Public Schools, Metropolitan Community College and Valmont Industries formed a public-private partnership and secured a grant to build a state-of-the-art welding lab at Fremont High School, it was only a matter of months before the years of talk were transformed into a real opportunity for students, beginning last fall.

The new welding program, housed at FHS, is aimed at providing career opportunities for young people while

employed who each teach a morning and afternoon session daily, bringing the program capacity to 120 students. Students from each of the District's 7 elementary sites can apply for the program. According to Dahl "the District continues to explore ways to bring these services to more children. Research has shown that school readiness is a key element in determining the success of students in school, and particularly those coming from low-income families."

FPS Superintendent Mark Shepard noted that the pre-school program is another of example of how the community and schools can work together to provide a higher level of service for children. ★

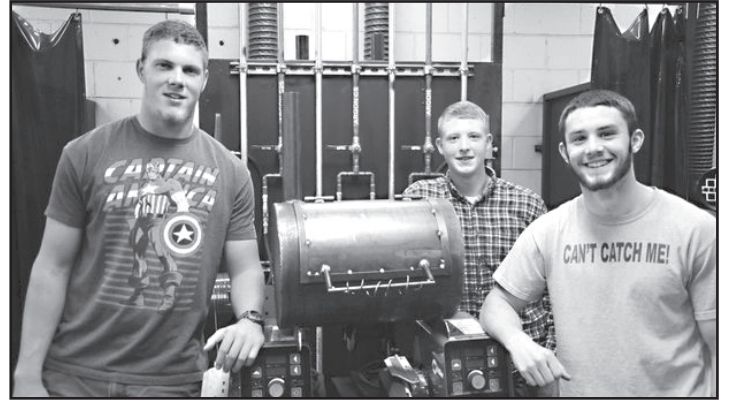

creating a skilled workforce for local businesses. Fremont Public Schools Superintendent Mark Shepard said once funding came through for the project last spring, those involved moved quickly to get the lab up and running for the beginning of classes last August.

"Literally as the students were walking out for the summer break, we had contractors in the parking lot ready to come in," Shepard said. "And by the afternoon they pretty much had this facility gutted."

One of Valmont's former welding technicians took over the Metro adjunct teaching position for the class. With more than 35 years of crafting metal, Jim

Weyer was asked to fill the position after his retirement last Memorial Day weekend.

Working with students together with FHS instructor Brad Ryun during the 80-minute class session, Weyer noted growth and improvement on a daily basis. Students are tested using standards that a technician applying at Valmont would be held to, Weyer said, and the level of skill illustrated left him with no doubt that they would be able to handle a full-time welding job.

"The testing is absolutely identical," he said. "The tests that I have done at Valmont have been done on these guys the same way, and they have done the same job. These guys are good, I have no doubt that they will make it out in the field."

Metropolitan Community College President Randy Schmailzl said the new partnership is a classic win-win because it will help move high school students into careers that are in demand.

"Not often in high school you can find that type of partnership, and this is hopefully the first of many," he said. "I think that's the real key to this, you're able

to show others how this works and then the benefits are to the local students. Ultimately you're going to have more of these (partnerships)."

State Sen. Charlie Janssen recalled discussing the partnership back when he was a member of the Fremont City Council running for state office. Now, he said, every state candidate is talking about the need to introduce more trades at the local level.

Fremont Mayor Scott Getzschman said ultimately the lab will make Fremont a better place to do business because of the opportunity it will provide for industry in finding skilled workers.

"It's a blessing that we have it," Getzschman said. "The trades, in my opinion, are the future in making and keeping not only Fremont and this region strong, but it's the foundation for the future of the United States."

Shepard said the five-course welding program is designed specifically for Fremont and its industry and local partners. The dual credit program being taught by both Fremont High School instructor Brad Ryun and Metro instructor Jim Weyer is a unique design. Shepard said it is a first of its kind for FPS but offers students the ability to leave Fremont High School with a diploma, dual credit from Metro and an industry certificate. "The other thing that we're hopeful for is that this will serve as a catalyst for the future," he said. "I think given what we have here today ... it's definitely a step in the right direction." ★

Foundation Honors Student-Scholars and Mentors

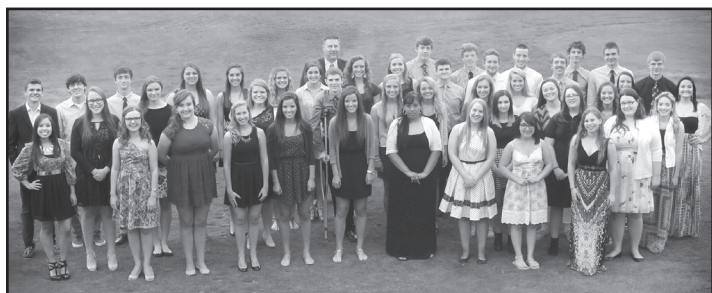
Approximately 250 students, parents and faculty mentors were in attendance at the Fremont Golf Club on April 12th for the Foundation's eleventh annual Academic Achievement Banquet. The event honored members of the Fremont High School class of 2015 who will graduate cum laude with distinction. Students being honored compiled a 3.75 grade point average over the course of their high school career, and did so while taking the most difficult and academically challenging courses offered by the Fremont Public Schools.

Prior to the banquet each honored student selected a Fremont Public Schools educator who served and a mentor and had inspired the students as they pursued their academic career. Those educators also attended the banquet as special guests.

Fremont Public Schools Superintendent Mark Shepard was the featured speaker, and shared a positive message for parents, students and faculty. He told parents the most rewarding thing as a parent is watching your children grow and develop, not only as students, but as people. Although there typically comes a time when parents are no longer able to help their children with things like math homework, the role of the parent evolves into one of guidance as their children make important life decisions.

"You are and you should be very proud of what your students accomplished," Shepard said. "It's a small reward for the hours and hours of work and guidance that you've provided to them."

Speaking to the mentors, Shepard noted that "There is no greater honor in

Creative Teaching Grant Supports Poetry Workshop for Middle School Students

More than 100 seventh grade students participated in the Slam Poetry Workshop as the result a Creative Teaching Grant from the Fremont Public School Foundation. Students were given the opportunity to develop their poetry and performance skills during the workshop, which was held in late April.

The workshop brought in four poets from the Nebraska Writers Collective who have won national and worldwide competitions. The poets provided guidance for students as they worked on developing a poem, and then had the opportunity to perform it during an open-mic session at the end of the day.

The Creative Teaching Grant was one of 16 awarded by the FPS Foundation this year as a means of stimulating creative teaching projects that could not be funded through the normal school budget. Foundation Board member Pam Murphy, who heads up the Grant committee, noted that the Poetry Workshop was a particularly fun grant to see implemented because it provided a special learning experience to so many students. education than to be recognized and honored by your students." He encouraged teachers to appreciate the time they have to help shape student's lives and the importance of the teacher-student dynamic.

Addressing the students, Shepard shared why he and his wife chose to bring their family to Fremont in the 1990s, and why they chose to return after a stint in Lincoln as an assistant superintendent. He told students that Fremont is a unique place in that the community has a firm grasp on what a community should be, and a school district focused on the success of its students. For that reasons "you're making our community proud."

The evening concluded with each student and mentor being introduced, and receiving a gift from the Foundation. This year 50 graduating seniors qualified for the honor. ★

Joseph William Stoll Jr. was born on Nov. 11, 1929, in Dunbar, the son of Joseph William Stoll Sr. and Ruth Esther (Williams) Stoll. He attended school and graduated from the Nebraska City High School with the class of 1947. He was united in marriage to Doris Grubaugh.
