FPS Foundation Matches Grant—Establishes Endowment Fund

The Fremont Public School Foundation has successfully raised \$10,000 in order to match the challenge grant offered by the Fremont Area Community Foundation. Under the agreement, the Community Foundation will now contribute \$10,000 to the fund and create an endowment account with a balance of \$20,000.

FPS Foundation President Jane Dugan noted that a large portion of the needed funding was provided by the Foundation Board of Directors. "I'm proud that 100% of our Board made contributions to make this endowment possible." Business support came from American National Bank, First State Bank,

Fremont National Bank and Sid Dillon Auto Dealers. Additionally, individual support came from Blake and Tanya Dillon, Ruth and Rupert Dunklau, Steve and Marcia Hull, Nick and Cheryl Lamme, Leona Paden, Steve and Julie Navarrette, and Dale and Fern Olson.

Foundation Executive Director David Pinkall said that the creation of the endowment fund will add to the financial stability of the Foundation. He noted that "the endowment will create yearly operating income, and decrease reliance on fundraising for operational expenses." ★

Construction Underway—Work on New 5-6 Center Begins



First order of business for the new 5-6 Center has been to haul in over 42,000 cubic yards of dirt to raise the site elevation by nearly 5 feet. The picture is taken looking northeast across the construction site, with the Middle School in the background.

Time seems to pass faster than the speed of light. On March 9, 2010, the community passed a \$10.6 million bond issue with a 60 percent positive vote. Although that March event seems so recent, here we are now in the middle of fall. In addition to the bond issue, federal Build America Bonds were issued in the amount of \$15,220,000. Because these bonds were part of the federal stimulus plan, they will rebate 35 percent of the interest charges over the life of the bonds. This will allow taxpayers in Fremont to recover approximately 6 million dollars they would have otherwise paid in interest charges.

All projects are proceeding according to schedule. Fauss Construction of Hooper was low bidder for the Clarmar Elementary School project, which will add two classrooms and a multi-purpose room.

The pages of this edition of *Cornerstone* are full of positive snapshots of a vibrant school district supported by a dedicated Alumni Association and a growing Foundation. I have a deep sense of appreciation for the efforts of the Alumni Association. It is estimated that there are over 12,000 living alumni of Fremont High School, and the task of keeping track of them is daunting to say the least. I know that the Alumni Association is always looking for help, and I hope that there will always be plenty of faithful volunteers to continue this important work

of, by and for the alumni of Fremont Public Schools.

I'm also excited to see evidence of the growth of the FPS Foundation recorded in this edition of *Cornerstone*. The classroom projector project, which began with the need for nearly three quarters of a million dollars worth of LCD projectors, is now in need of less than \$100,000. I believe that in the next edition of *Cornerstone* we will announce successful completion of this important project. The Creative Teaching Grant program is now operational, and FPS teachers are responding with wonderful projects aimed at providing high quality classroom instruction for all of our students. 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Creative Teaching Grant Program In Second Year

Last winter, the first Creative Teaching Grants were awarded. There were 11 submissions and six teachers were selected to receive funds ranging from \$300 to \$500. The requests included Flip video cameras to assist students in making presentations in a math and an English classroom, "Playaways" (personal audiobooks) for the Middle School library, a document presenter in a fourth-grade classroom, parent books for students with stuttering problems, and a plan to provide transportation for adult blind mentors for visually impaired students. A committee with representation from the FPS Foundation Board, elementary administration, and the president of the local teachers' association (a Middle School teacher), reviewed all the selections and made the determinations. Even those that were not selected were excellent submissions, but some were limited by the technology of the district or the fact that the materials requested were only temporary. This year, we have already received over 20

submissions and the committee will find its work has become more difficult – but in a very positive way.

One of the purposes of the FPS Foundation is to provide staff and students with materials, equipment and programs that cannot be covered financially by taxpayer dollars. While most of our projects have been on a grander scale, such as the renovation of the theater, the installation of AEDs (automatic external defibrillators) in the buildings, and the plan to place digital projectors in all classrooms, there was also a goal of providing funds to teachers that would allow them to become more innovative and creative in their classrooms. The impetus for meeting this goal arose from memorial funds that were presented to the Foundation after the death of Dr. Ken Thomson, former principal at Fremont High School. This led to the establishment of the Creative Teaching Grants program for teachers, and now all memorial funds donated on behalf of FPS

staff and their families are earmarked for this program. The Foundation is extremely grateful that the generosity of so many will have a lasting legacy in our classrooms.

Teachers are extremely motivated by the Foundation's focus on their individual classroom needs, and they have shown their own generosity in terms of donations and through payroll deductions. To those who have contributed to memorials in the past, the Foundation is extremely grateful. Please remember to consider the FPS Foundation as a place to honor someone who has been a part of the Fremont Public Schools as a student, staff member or community supporter. The Foundation is grateful to the Thomson family for the "seed money," and we appreciate your support in helping our schools to honor others with creative and innovative approaches that will enhance student learning. ★

Construction Underway—Work on New 5-6 Center Begins (continued from page 1)

Relocating the administration area to the new addition will provide additional space for student services. Other work includes replacing the boiler and remodeling the media center/computer lab. Improvement to the parking lot also is scheduled.

The project at Fremont High School will be bid in December and, depending upon the weather, it is anticipated that construction could begin in January or February 2011. Improvements include the addition of eight general classrooms, which will house the Social Studies department, two Family and Consumer Science classrooms and one Special Education Science room. Remaining special education classes will be

regrouped and moved to the former Family and Consumer Science area, which will be remodeled to accommodate that change.

Site work already has begun on the Five-Six School located on the south corner at the intersection of Johnson Road and Fremont Drive (south and west of the existing Middle School). That facility will house 32 standard classrooms plus art, music, physical education, special education and other services. Plans currently call for a structure of 103,000 square feet. The project is scheduled to be bid in January 2011 with construction beginning in February, depending again upon weather conditions. The new facility should be completed in May or June 2012. The new

school is scheduled to open August 2012 and will house all the district's fifth and sixth grade students.

The Linden Elementary School project, which includes the removal of the older two-story structure and replacement of nine classrooms on the West side, will be bid in April 2011. It is expected that work will be completed by the end of August 2012.

Currently, the bidding climate is good and we do not expect any difficulties relating to costs, although that could change quickly. You may find additional information concerning the construction projects and many other issues on our website at www.fpsweb.org ★

FPS Foundation Pledges \$25,000 to Projector Fund 33 Classrooms Are Left to be Equipped

At their October meeting, the FPS Foundation heard an update from Terry Snyder, Executive Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment for the Fremont Public Schools regarding the status of the classroom projector project undertaken by the Foundation. The project seeks to place an LCD projector in each core classroom in the district. The projectors allow teachers to utilize power point presentations and other curriculum materials that are available electronically for classroom instruction. Snyder explained that purchases of textbooks and other curriculum materials all contain materials that are electrically stored on a computer disk, and require the use of a computer and an LCD projector in order to make the information available to students. Each core classroom contains a computer, but the projectors are needed to deliver the information to the students.

In 2008 the FPS Foundation applied for and received a \$100,000 grant from the Fremont Area Community Foundation for the purchase of LCD projectors. At that time the District had 238 classrooms in need of projectors. In the last two years, with projector purchases made with

the Community Foundation Grant, additional projectors purchased through the use of available curriculum funds, and other purchases made through donations to the FPS Foundation, Snyder reported that the total number of core classrooms still in need of a projector is down to 45. Snyder also noted that the need to have this technology available in all classrooms is becoming more critical. At a recent meeting of FPS Language Arts teachers, for example, one of the requests/needs that surfaced was to have LCD projectors in all of the classrooms so all teachers can take advantage of the instructional tools with all students. After hearing the report, the FPS Foundation Board pledged an additional \$25,000 to the project from available Foundation funds. With the cost of equipping a classroom with an LCD projector standing at about \$2,200 per classroom, the total number of projectors needed now stands at 33. Nearly all of the classrooms in need of a projector are in elementary buildings. As noted by Superintendent Dr. Steve Sexton, the time seems right to complete this project and move on.

Annual Campaign Kicks Off—Local Businesses Lead the Way

The Fremont Public School Foundation's Annual Campaign is now underway! Board Chairperson Jane Dugan noted that the annual campaign provides funding for the operation of the Foundation Office including supplies, salaries and printing expenses for Cornerstone. "It takes a minimum of \$30,000 to cover the costs of operating the Foundation Office for one year. We've set our campaign goal at \$40,000 with the intention of also providing additional support for the completion of the projector project." The projector project, as noted in a separate article, is an ongoing effort to equip each classroom in the District with an LCD projector."

Three Fremont Banks have already led the way with major contributions to the campaign. American National Bank, First State Bank, and Fremont National Bank have demonstrated their dedication to the work carried out by the Foundation through "Patron" level donations. ★

She goes on to say that it was housed in a couple different places on the 5th block of Broad St. Students helped to decorate and later to sign up for clean up duty. It was open on Tuesday, Friday and Saturday nights from about 7:30 pm to 11 or 12 pm. It was a great place to dance, play ping-pong, watch TV, and socialize, especially after football and basketball games. The Canteen must have been in operation from about 1947-48 to at least 1953-54. It was really a pretty neat place to hang out. She was a 1953 graduate of Fremont High and a 1957 graduate of Midland College, so she has close ties to Fremont and enjoys our newsletter. Thanks Mary. I know that the canteen also was open in the late 50's and early 60's. One of the big things that happened at the Canteen was that Peter Fonda and a friend of his came in one night. The following is the obituary of Mercedes L Reed, who taught a lot of us over the span of 31 years. She taught mothers, fathers, daughters and sons alike. Many of us have some fond and not so fond memories of her, so I thought I would share this with you and you can reminisce about those memories.



Mercedes L. Reed, 99

Died: Saturday, January 10, 2009, in Fremont

Mercedes was born July 8, 1909 on a Wayne County, Nebraska farm to Irve and Pearl (Albright) Reed.

She grew up on the farm, without electricity, telephone, or indoor plumbing. She began school at 4 years of age, graduated from country school district 48, and graduated from Wayne High School at age 15. Later, she earned her teacher's certificate and began teaching in Ponca. Then she moved from a rural school west of her farm home to another rural school south of Wayne for a year. She taught 4 years at Emerson, while attending the University of Washington working on her Master's degree during the summers. This was followed by 4 years in Allen, being the principal and teaching. She taught briefly in Valley before going to work in the Mead Ordnance Plant in Mead, NE. In 1943, Fremont's superintendent of schools, John G. Hansen, got Mercedes started teaching in Fremont, and she completed 31 years in Fremont's schools. Among her teaching assignments, were physical education, driver's education for 19 years, and math. She retired in 1975. In her early years in Fremont she also was the Director of the Parks and Recreation playgrounds. Mercedes travel extensively. She has been in most of the states, also Cuba, Australia, New Zealand, Tahiti,

Fiji Islands, Mexico, Canada, many European countries, and 5 World Fairs.

She always had a flower garden and belonged to a garden club for 35 years. She was a past president of the AAUW, belonged to and extension club, and Junior Women's Club. She was a member of ADK (teacher's sorority), and she was a bridge player. She was with the hospital auxiliary for 16 years, and in 1966 she was chosen as the 'Good Neighbor' of Fremont. She drove for Meals on Wheels for 18 years, and was a guide or gift store attendant at May Museum for 16 years and a hostess at the Art Building for several years. She had served as membership chairman of AARP, courtesy chairman for retired teachers. As a long time member of the First United Methodist Church in Fremont, she had been secretary of her church circle and co-chairman of the Worship Table for UMW (United Methodist Women).
