Projector Project Completed

A four-year shared technology project of the Fremont Public School Foundation and the Fremont Public Schools has been completed. Fremont Schools Superintendent, Dr. Steve Sexton, reported that digital projectors have now been purchased for all of the district's 236 core classrooms. Installation of the digital projectors is continuing and should be completed sometime next spring.

The digital projectors are the cornerstone of an upgrade to expand the application of technology for the improvement of student learning and teacher efficiency. The projectors, which allow images from teacher's computers to be projected, have become a standard piece of equipment for classrooms across the country. According to Dr. Sexton, digital projectors open the door for a new generation of educational technology which cannot be accessed without them. He noted that "instructional materials increasingly come with CDdriven programs that require the use of a digital projector in order to deliver the materials to students."

Major outside funding for the project was also provided by the Fremont Community Foundation through a \$100,000 grant to the FPS Foundation, and the Fremont High School Alumni Association with a \$10,000 grant. Local PTA units also pitched in to provide projectors or comparable technology for their buildings. Sexton noted that without the help of the FPS Foundation, this project could not have been completed, and that future help will be necessary to keep the Fremont Public Schools on the cutting edge of the rapidly-changing technology needs of today's schools. Sexton said that providing the same level of technological exposure that students experience in neighboring suburban school districts poses a particular challenge.

According to Dr. David Pinkall, FPS Foundation Executive Director, the Foundation Board of Directors is firmly committed to continuing to raise funds to support the growing technology needs of the District. "We want our Fremont students to be on a level playing field when they compete for college scholarships and jobs against students from other school districts." 🛧



School Construction Update

Work continues on the construction projects made possible by the passage of the bond issue in March of 2010 and the issuance of Build America Bonds. According to Superintendent Dr. Steve Sexton, all projects are on schedule and within budget. Here is a project by project summary:

Clarmar School: The project was completed for the opening of the school year. Improvements included the construction of an addition which includes a new entry and service drive, two classrooms, administrative offices and multipurpose room. The existing computer lab was remodeled, and a sprinkler system was added to the existing building.

Linden School: The project includes the construction of an addition containing administrative offices and 10 classrooms, the addition of parking space, and removal of the

original two story structure built as a WPA project in 1939. The project is on schedule, and will be completed for the beginning of the 2012 school year.

Fremont High School: The project includes construction of a new entry, commons and concession areas adjacent to the Al Bahe Gymnasium; the construction of 11 new classrooms for Family Consumer Science, Social Studies and Special Education Science; and the remodeling of the lunchroom serving area. The lunchroom service

area was completed for the beginning of the school year and is currently in use. Construction on the classroom addition is on schedule and will be in use by Christmas. The new entry, commons and concession area opened on schedule for the first home basketball game.

5/6 Grade Center: The project is on schedule and will be occupied in August of 2012.

Elementary Entrance Improvements: Projects have been completed on schedule and are in use at Grant, Howard, and Washington Schools.

Annual Campaign Underway - Local Banks Lead the Way

According to Board President, Jane Dugan, donations to the annual campaign are important because they enable the operation of the office, including the publication of Cornerstone, to continue. 
Great Day for a Great Cause

Foundation Supports Many FPS Programs

Much has been written in Cornerstone about major projects undertaken by the FPS Foundation in its 8-year history. Projects such as the Nell McPherson Theatre Renovation, the purchase of automatic external defibrillators, and the purchase of digital projectors have been well-documented. Less is known about how the Foundation provides an avenue for private support of a variety of programs within the Fremont Public Schools. Below is a listing of a few of the programs that have restricted flowthrough accounts in the Foundation, and into which private contributions are made regularly:

- Elementary school accounts are provided for most of the Fremont's Elementary Schools. These accounts allow the schools to utilize the tax-exempt status of the Foundation to raise private funds for special projects. Several schools have purchased special playground equipment through such accounts with the Foundation.
- The elementary counseling department maintains a fund for special training and materials for the counselors. The fund is supported through private donations.
- Special projects for the Bahe gymnasium are funded through an account supported by advertising in the gym. Scoreboards and wrestling mats have been purchased through this account without the use of tax dollars.
- The High School speech and debate department has utilized an account with the Foundation to provide private funding to support the debate program.
- The Vocal Music Booster Club has an account with the Foundation. Donations are received regularly, and the proceeds are used to provide private support of activities such as the spring musical, and to purchase special equipment such as risers and acoustical shells.

The use of these flow-through accounts, and others like them, is a good example of one more way in which the FPS Foundation helps match donors with specific needs within the Fremont Public Schools. \bigstar

We lost several of our teachers this year who were impacted many lives over the years that they taught at Fremont Public Schools. Pearl Schultz, she taught many of us music, and John McMullen, wrestling coach and Biology teacher.

Pearl Schultz

Pearl M. Schultz, 96, of Fremont died Monday, July 25, 2011, at Fremont Area Medical Center.

Pearl was born at Cortland on March 20, 1915, to Paul and Anna (During) Schultz. She graduated from Cortland High School in 1931 and continued her education at Nebraska Wesleyan University in Lincoln, earning a bachelor of fine arts degree. Graduate work was done at the University of Nebraska, the University of Colorado at Boulder and Denver University. She earned a master of music degree from Northwestern University at Evanston, III.

She was a career teacher, having taught in the public schools at District 4 in Gage County, and also in Campbell, Tekamah, Columbus and Fremont.

After retiring, she did volunteer work for Meals on Wheels, the Low Income Ministry, and for 19 years was a docent at the Dodge County Museum. Since 1988, she tutored Spanish speaking adults in English.

She was a member of First United Methodist Church in Fremont, having joined the Cortland Methodist Church in 1923. She was also a member of the United Methodist Women and the Mary Circle. And she was a member of Delta Kappa Gamma, the Fremont Area Retired School Personnel, and for more than 50 years a member of Venus Chapter 49 Order of Eastern Star of Cortland.

She is survived by: a sister, Lillian Schultz of Fremont; a niece, Jeannene Douglass of Lincoln; a nephew, Dr. Rod Douglass (and wife, Eileen) of Los Alamos, N.M.; a grand niece, Megan Douglass of Lincoln; and a grandnephew, Brian Douglass (and wife, Ashley) of Albuquerque, N.M.

John Charles McMullen, 76, of Fremont died Friday, Oct. 28, 2011, at A.J. Merrick Manor in Fremont.

John was born Jan. 27, 1935, in Chicago to John P. and Florence (Andres) McMullen. He graduated from Parker High School in Chicago in 1952 and from Peru State College in Nebraska in 1956. He received his

master of arts degree in 1960 from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. John taught biology and psychology at Fremont High School for 39 years. He coached football, track and field and wrestling for many of those years while at Fremont High School. He was also an adjunct instructor at Clarkson College in Omaha for three years and at Wayne State College in Wayne for many years.

John married Lois Puppe on Aug. 26, 1956, in Nebraska City. He was a member of First Congregational Church, UCC, in Fremont where he served on several boards, taught church school and mentored confirmation.

Some of his professional honors include: induction in the Nebraska State Wrestling Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1983; Outstanding Service Award in Wrestling from the Nebraska School Activities Association in 1998; the Christa McAuliffe Special Recognition Prize in Education from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln; and induction to the Fremont Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003.

Survivors include: his wife, Lois; son, Mike (and wife, Katie) McMullen of Houston; daughter, Janet (and husband, Paul) Schorfheide of Lincoln; grandchildren, Ivy and Maya McMullen and Matt Schorfheide; sister-in-law, Margaret Richards of Lincoln; nephews and nieces and great-nephews and great-nieces.

He was preceded in death by his parents, John P. and Florence Mc-Mullen; mother and father-in-law, Gus and Marie Puppe; sister-in-law and brothers-in-law, Marilyn and Dean Stauffer and John Richards.

As a member of the girls Pep Club, whose duty it was to sell season tickets to downtown merchants, we also sat in a group to cheer. This was the beginning efforts to have night games in hoping to get some revenue for uniforms.

The band wore cotton sweatshirts with a large F on the front. White in the spring and black in the fall. The girls pep club wore black jumpers with orange organdy blouses with a bow in front. We were as proud of our team as the best, and the band. Uniforms were not necessary to the school board during the severe financial depression.

Cooking classes were cancelled as they were fueled by gas which was stopped. In spite of severe faculty limitations, were able to have The Pirates of Pensance performed. Our music teacher, Hugh Rangeler, after presenting such an ambitious and successful performance, was then hired by Lincoln. It was a blow to all music students but we understood. He had taught the second semester with no pay. He had

a very successful career in Lincoln and was equally admired there. The big wide steps from the front door of the high school were suddenly divided by a double railing from the front door up to the second floor. It was a short time before Ray Hammond and Bill Cheney discovered it was a perfect slide. One only had to have somebody to hold the big front doors open as you ended your slide running full speed. One afternoon at 3:20, my mother had to pick me up at school. As she waited she saw the front doors open and Ray and Bill, then the Hammond twins, and then her daughter exit running at full speed. She was amazed. Needless to say it was only a few weeks before the principal was alerted and the fun was stopped. It still was possible on occasion if you had the cooperation from friends who alerted you to the fact nobody was watching.
