i Give for iPads Campaign Reaches Goal!

he largest fund raising effort ever taken on by the Fremont Public School Foundation went over the top in less than four months this fall. The i Give for iPads campaign was designed to raise funds for the purchase of iPads for student use at each of the District's seven elementary schools, and was part of a larger project in which District funds were utilized to provide iPads at Johnson Crossing 5-6 Academic Center. The total cost of the project was nearly onehalf million dollars, with the Foundation Portion of the project being over \$219,000.

The ambitious Foundation project, chaired by Foundation Board member Jennifer Benson, was kicked off with a \$50,000 grant from the Fremont Area Community Foundation in August. A number of major donations from businesses and individuals got the ball rolling early in the fall, including a \$27,500 gift from First State Bank to fund the effort at their partner school, Linden Elementary. Fremont Elementary School PTAs made major contributions to insure that elementary students in all of Fremont's elementary schools will have access to iPad technology, and several schools held special events to raise funds for the project. At Linden School, students raised over \$1,000 by purchasing strips of duct tape, which they used to duct tape Principal Chad Radke to the ovm wall! A committee of teachers made numerous presentations to potential donors and service clubs, and a special tailgate event was organized which provided fun for participants, and raised over \$25,000 in support of the project. Finally, hundreds of parents and FPS supporters made contributions to make the completion of the project possible.

FPS Superintendent Announces Retirement

remont Public School Superintendent, Dr. Steve Sexton has apparent

the end of the current academic year. Sexton, whose tenure of 17 years as superintendent ranks as one of the longest in FPS history, will hand the reigns over to Associate Superintendent Mark Shepard, who will assume the superintendent position in August. The Sexton years in Fremont have seen an impressive number of accomplishments by the school district, including the move to a Middle School configuration and the passage of two major bond issues totaling over \$40 million. The construction made

possible by the bond issues virtually changed the face of the Fremont Public Schools. A new middle school, a new elmentary school and a new 5-6 Center Center were all constructed; and additions were added to the high school and every existing elementary building.

In addition to upgrading the facilities of the school Steve Sexton, has announced his retirement at system, Sexton was also responsible for organizing an

extensive curriculum audit, conducted by Phi Delta Kappa. The results of that audit and subsequent changes eventually resulted in the Fremont Public Schools being the first school in Nebraska to receive district-wide accreditation from the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement in 2011. The founding of the Fremont Public School Foundation also took place under his leadership in 2003.

An interesting side note, the only known superintendent to have surpassed Dr Sexton's record for longevity was also a Sexton (no relation). Lloyd Sexton served as superintendent for a total of 19 years, from 1957 to 1976.

Class of 1962 Initiates New Scholarship Program

About 25 years ago a scholarship was created at FHS by Jim Ebers of the class of 1962. Jim believed creating the scholarship was a way to honor class sponsors, Skip Anderson and Darlene Ritter, and supporting the next generation of leaders. Now the class of 1962, inspired by Jim, their class sponsors and in honor of those classmates that have gone before, have come together to increase the funds and provide a minimum annual \$2,000 scholarship to future FHS graduates.

The new fund, which will be operated through the Fremont Area Community Foundation, will be endowed, and has been established with a matching gift challenge to double funds received by classmates up to \$20,000.

Eligibility requirements for student applicants will include a minimum GPA of 2.5, extracurricular involvement, and financial need may be considered. Students who apply can be going into any area of study and may plan to attend a 2- or 4-year college or university or a vocational or technical school.

"It's been really wonderful to work with the alumni members of the Class of 1962," said Jessica Janssen, former Foundation Executive Director. "They have been very thoughtful in their creation of the scholarship, carefully considering financial stewardship and the legacy they want to leave as a class. The annual amount given and the inclusivity of the eligibility requirements make this scholarship one of the largest and most flexible that we currently have at the Foundation. They are truly celebrating the future of the next generation while honoring their class." Surviving class sponsor, Skip Anderson, noted that the class of 1962 had great spirit, and many leaders in their class. He especially remembers that they were responsible for putting on the first senior prom held in the "new" high school gym at 19th and Lincoln Street, and that they had a lot of fun decorating.

Gerry Meyer, Long Time FHS Principals Dies at 97

Gerry Meyer, who served as Fremont High Principal for an entire generation of Fremont students, died November 21st in Lincoln at the age of 97. Meyer served in the US Navy during World War II before coming to Fremont as a teacher and coach in 1946. In 1951 he took over as FHS Principal, a position which he held until 1976 when he moved to the Central Office as Assistant Superintendent. He retired in 1982. During his tenure as Principal he oversaw the move from the old High School at 9th and Main to the current High School location at 16th and Lincoln. In addition to his professional activities, Meyer was also active in numerous community activities, serving on the Boards of Kiwanis, YMCA, Salvation Army, the Rod and Gun Club and Salem Lutheran Church.

Project Fit America Completed at Johnson Crossing and Linden School

Students at Johnson Crossing and Linden Elementary School might soon notice increased physical fitness thanks to new equipment provided by community organizations and a national non-profit.

The Fremont Area Medical Center, Fremont Area Community Foundation, Project Fit America and Fremont Public School Foundation combined their efforts to create innovative Fitness in Education. The project is a continued introduction of Project Fit America's Official Nebraska State Model and pilot program, which began in 2002.

Project Fit America is a nonprofit organization that builds sustainable physical education programs in schools. Its programming includes state-of-the-art equipment designed to address areas where children fail fitness tests. The program includes curriculum with games, activities and challenges for students using outdoor and indoor equipment, on site teacher training and in class instruction.

Johnson Crossing Principal Brent Cudly said since the program began in 1990 it has helped more than 800 schools in 300 cities in 40 states become fit and healthy. The equipment will provide additional activities for students at recess and during PE class. Chad Radke, Linden Elementary School Principal said the program's encouragement of physical fitness is significant for young students. "In this day and age with all the computer and video games, this encourages kids to get active and live a healthy lifestyle," he said.

Bill Vobejda, vice president of Fremont Area Medical Center, said the hospital is thrilled to provide the opportunity for student fitness. After this year, Fremont Area Medical Center will have sponsored four Project Fit America sites.

Students who are tested before and after participating in the program demonstrate a significant increase in fitness. On average students participating demonstrated a 23 percent increase in upper body strength and a 13 percent increase in abdominal strength.

Research has shown that physical education not only promotes good health, it can play a role in a student's academic success as well. "Physically active kids are better learners. Quality Fitness in Education has a direct impact not only a child's health but their academic success," Stacey Cook, executive director of Project Fit America, said in a statement. "We applaud Fremont Area Medical Center for taking the leadership role to bring this program to the community. This exemplary partnership demonstrates we can all work together to make a difference to improve the health of children."

FHS Superintendent, Dr. Steve Sexton praised the effort, noting that the project insures that the 1700 children in Fremont's elementary schools will now have access to another piece of current technology.

FPS Foundation Board Chairperson Jennifer Peterson said that the project provided a great example of the Fremont Community coming together to support education for children. "To be able to raise over \$200,000 in such a short period is a real tribute to our community, and its commitment to the importance of our children's education."

A listing of contributors to this successful project is included in the Bricks and Mortar section of this newsletter.

- * The U.S. Surgeon General reports that since 1980 childhood obesity has tripled.
- * Health experts have indicated that this may the first generation of children not expected to outlive their parents due to the health problems associated with obesity.
- * The government estimates 6 million American children are now overweight enough to endanger their health. An additional 5 million are on the threshold and the problem is growing even more extreme as it becomes more widespread.
- * Obesity harms a child by creating adult diseases that are now occurring in childhood such as gallbladder disease, sleep apnea, Type 2 diabetes and Metabolic Syndrome.
- * The lack of fitness and health awareness contributes to many problems as cited by classroom teachers. Some examples include: Lack of self-esteem, hyperactivity, aggressive behavior resulting in classroom disruptions/playground fights and experimenting with unsafe diet practices such as fasting, diet pills, purging.
- * The Centers for Disease Control states: "Students who earn higher grades are twice as likely to get regular physical activity as compared to students who earn low grades. Seventy-six percent of students who receive mostly D's and F's are not physically active on a regular basis."

Sajevic Leads Annual Campaign

The Fremont Public School Foundation's Annual Campaign is now underway! Foundation Board member Lori Sajevic, who is heading up this year's campaign, noted that the annual campaign provides funding for the operation of the Foundation Office including supplies, salaries and printing expenses for Cornerstone. It takes a minimum of \$30,000 to cover the costs of operating the Foundation Office for one year. The campaign goal has been set at \$40,000, with the intention of also providing additional support for the updating of technology within the district. The integration of new technology, such as smart boards and ipads, continues to provide a financial challenge for the District to keep current with the latest trends.

Three Fremont Banks have already led the way with major contributions to the campaign. American National Bank, First State Bank, and Fremont National Bank have demonstrated their dedication to the work carried out by the Foundation through "Patron" level donations.

erald William "Gerry" Meyer, 97, of Fremont passed away Thursday, Nov. 21, 2013, at Southlake Village in Lincoln.

He was born Sept. 18, 1916, in Hooper to Herman and Sophie Wobken Meyer. He was the 11th of 12 children, growing up with five older brothers, five older sisters,

and one younger sister.

He became the first member of his family to attend college, graduating from Midland Lutheran College in 1938. While at Midland, he participated in football, basketball, as well as other activities. He also gained the nickname "Moose," by which he was thereafter known to many of his friends.

While taking summer school classes at the University of Iowa in Iowa City, Iowa, he met Mildred Ruth Clauson. They were married in Aledo, III., on July 15, 1941, and celebrated 72 happy years together this summer.

Before coming to Fremont in 1946, he held teaching, coaching and principal positions at McCool Junction and Pender. His career was interrupted by World War II, during which he served as a ground training instructor for the United States Navy at its base in Pensacola, Fla. After the war, he came to Fremont High School, serving initially as a mathematics teacher and coach. He was promoted to assistant principal in 1949 and principal in 1951. He served in the latter capacity for 24 years, until 1975. He spent the last seven years of his career as the assistant superintendent, before retiring in 1982.

In addition to his professional activities, he was active in a variety of community organizations. He was a member of the YMCA Board of Directors, the Salvation Army Advisory Board, the Kiwanis Club, and the Rod and Gun Club. He was a life member of the National Education Association and a member of the Nebraska Association of School Administrators. He was a longtime member of Salem Lutheran Church, serving on the church council as well as a variety of other positions.

An avid sportsman, Gerry enjoyed hunting, fishing and golf. He was elected to the Midland Warrior Athletic Hall of Fame in 1989 and received the Distinguished Midland Alumni Award in 2001.

He is survived by Millie Meyer, his wife 72 years; his son, Chris (and wife, Janet) Jorgensen of Sarasota, Fla.; by his son, Dan (and wife, Debra) of Manchester, lowa; and by his daughter, Ann Woerth (and husband, Lyle) of Lincoln. He also is survived by his grandchildren: Kate Huckelbridge (and husband, Craig) of Oakland, Calif., Stacy Meyer of Portland, Ore., Jon Meyer (and wife, Jennifer) of Cleveland, Ohio, Robert Meyer of Washington, D.C., Emily and Scott Meyer of Iowa City, Iowa, and Karl and Christopher Woerth of Lincoln. In addition, he is survived by great-grandchildren, Jennah Meyer, Lila Huckelbridge, Brynn Huckelbridge and Haines Huckelbridge. Of his 11 siblings, he is survived only by his younger sister, Lois Bowman of Hooper.

The funeral will be 10:30 a.m. Monday at Salem Lutheran Church, 401 E. Military Ave., in Fremont. Visitation will be from 2-6 p.m. Sunday at Ludvigsen Mortuary, 1249 E. 23rd St., in Fremont with the family present from 3-5 p.m. Burial will take place immediately following the service at Memorial Cemetery, 800 W. 23rd St., in Fremont. A luncheon at the church will follow the graveside service.
