Fremont Grad to Address FHS Honorees

Dr. Benjamin Sasse, a 1990 Fremont High School graduate, will be the featured speaker for this year's Academic Achievement Banquet which honors outstanding graduates of Fremont High School along with their parents and selected faculty mentors. The annual event is sponsored by the Fremont Public School Foundation.

Sasse has recently been named as president-elect of Midland Lutheran College in Fremont. Sasse, who has worked as a consultant to Fortune 500 companies and served numerous roles in the federal government, was most recently U.S. Assistant Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS).

After graduating from Fremont High School, Sasse attended Harvard, Oxford and St. John's before receiving his Ph.D. from Yale. He began his career with the Boston Consulting Group, worked with the Department of Justice and was chief of staff for Congressman Jeff Fortenberry. At HHS he led policy, strategic planning and research across the Department's 11 operating divisions. He currently teaches public policy at the Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs at the University of Texas. ★

FPS Foundation Receives Challenge Grant

The Fremont Public School Foundation has received notification that it has been chosen to receive a Challenge Grant from the Fremont Area Community Foundation. In order to receive the grant, the FPS Foundation has until March 15, 2011, to raise \$10,000 for an endowment fund with the Community Foundation. Once the \$10,000 has been raised, the Community Foundation will match the \$10,000, thereby creating a \$20,000 endowment fund with the Community Foundation.

According to Kristine Gale, Executive Director of the Fremont Area Community Foundation, the challenge grant program is intended to encourage selected organizations to create long-term financial stability through the use of endowments that can provide yearly income. The Fremont Public School Foundation Board of Directors voted at their annual meeting on March 2nd to accept the challenge and move forward with fundraising in order to receive the matching funds. ★

From the Executive Director's Desk

As those of us who live in Eastern Nebraska emerge from one of the more trying winters in recent memory, there has been plenty of activity to keep us busy and warm. I am pleased to announce that the Alumni Association and FPS Foundation are joining forces to provide a more comprehensive publication for you, our alumni and FPS constituents. Implementing changes took us a little longer than expected to get this issue of Cornerstone to press. But, we hope the format will be one that you will enjoy. We are confident that this new format will allow us to more efficiently and effectively deliver our services to you.

As we enter into a closer relationship with the Alumni Association, I want to clarify for you the purposes of the Alumni Association and the Foundation. Even though the two organizations overlap in some areas, there also are important differences. While the Foundation operates as a separate organization from the Fremont Public Schools, its mission is to support FPS, and direct ties are maintained with FPS. For example, while the Foundation has its own board of directors, they must be approved by the Fremont Board of Education. 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Build America Bonds Will Finance 5-6 Center

A federal stimulus program will provide funding for the construction of a new 5th and 6th grade center for the Fremont Public Schools. Construction of the facility, which will be located near the current Middle School, is expected to begin this spring. The target is a fall 2012 opening. Fremont Superintendent Dr. Steve Sexton notes that the use of federal funds to erect school facilities is not a new concept. As an example, the original two-story portion of Linden School – erected in 1939 – is a project of the Public Works Administration under the Roosevelt administration. The use of Build America Bonds required a majority vote of the Fremont Board of Education, which was accomplished at the January meeting. **The project is expected to cost \$13.1 million, and the use of Build America Bonds will rebate 35 percent of the interest back to the School District. This saves an estimated \$6,000,000 for District taxpayers.**

Sexton emphasizes that it is essential that planning for the 5-6 Center considers and implements requirements for future elementary and middle school growth. To accommodate growth, the Center will result in approximately 15 spaces becoming available at the elementary level. Fifteen spaces also will become available at the middle school level. Sexton explains that this is a one time immediate opportunity. Taking advantage of the Build America Bonds program will **allow District taxpayers to recover approximately \$6,000,000** they otherwise would have paid in interest. “This is a source of funds that will disappear approximately 10 months from now in December. So, it is important to take advantage of these savings for the District while they are available,” Sexton said. ★

Fremont Voters Approve Bond Issue

On March 9, Fremont voters approved a general obligation bond issue that is separate from the Build America Bonds. These bonds will provide for a number of District needs, including:

1. Linden Elementary School
 - a. Replace the 1939 two-story building with single-story construction of approximately 15,000 square feet
 - b. Replace the boiler heating system
 - c. Finish necessary site development
2. Clarmar Elementary School
 - a. Add classrooms, commons and support areas
 - b. Remodel student services and media center/library areas
 - c. Replace the boiler heating system
3. Fremont High School
 - a. Add 10 standard classroom spaces
 - b. Add one special education classroom space
 - c. Renovate Family and Consumer Science facilities (formerly Home Economics)
 - d. Add commons and expand cafeteria availability located on northwest side of the high school
4. Clarmar Elementary School, Grant Elementary School, Howard Elementary School and Washington Elementary School
 - a. Conclude minor remodel to main entrance areas at these four locations for safety and security reasons

The projected bond requirement for the above stated projects is approximately \$10.6 million. A levy of 2.3 cents will be needed to pay for these bonds, which already is included in the tax levy. Build America Bonds allow districts to levy up to 5.2 cents to pay for construction. Fremont Public Schools will levy 4.7 cents to cover this project. So, these two actions will require a total levy of 7 cents to pay for the bonds. The increase in the overall levy is expected to be zero, based on current district valuation, estimated construction costs and projected future economic conditions. Presently, 7 cents is levied that will be assigned to debt service for bond payment, so there is no projected levy increase.

Superintendent Dr. Steve Sexton noted that planning for the projects is in progress, and that some renovation and construction will begin during the current year, with completion projected for 2012. ★

Foundation/Alumni Association Consolidate Operations

The Fremont Public School Foundation and Fremont Alumni Association are consolidating selected operations in order to allow both organizations to be more efficient and offer improved services to FPS Alumni and constituents. The most immediately noticeable change will be the combining of the respective newsletters into one comprehensive newsletter. This edition of Cornerstone represents the first effort at a combined newsletter, and for the first time readers will find Tiger Tracks contained within Cornerstone. This move will substantially increase the number of people who receive Tiger Tracks, will provide more broad-based information about current FPS operations to alumni, and will provide cost savings for both organizations.

Virginia Bader Marshall (class of 1964), past president of the Alumni Association and current treasurer, noted that the consolidation of operations will be a “work in progress as we learn more about how our organizations can work together to provide great services.” ★

Foundation to Manage Alumni Scholarship Program

The Fremont Public School Foundation has agreed to take over the management of the Fremont Alumni Scholarship Program. The scholarship program was begun by the class of 1948, and it eventually was extended to include support from all alumni. It has been managed faithfully by Dave Christensen (class of 1948) since its inception, and has grown into an endowment fund of nearly \$100,000. It provides scholarship help for needy Fremont High School graduates each year.

Christensen has asked for a well-deserved rest after his long and faithful work on this project, and the FPS Foundation and the Fremont Area Community Foundation (where the funds are held) have entered into an agreement that will guarantee that this worth-while program will continue.

The FPS Foundation will send mailings under separate cover for the scholarship program and donations will be deposited in the Alumni Scholarship Endowment Fund with the Community Foundation. A selection process has been implemented which meets federal regulations and will continue to be used each year to select recipients for the award.

Thank you to the class of 1948 and to Dave Christensen for creating a scholarship program that will continue to serve deserving FHS graduates! Donations to the Alumni Scholarship Program can be sent to the FPS Foundation Office at any time, but they must be specified for the Alumni Scholarship Program. ★

Creative Teaching Grants Awarded

One of the highlights of the Foundation's activities this year has been the selection of the recipients of the Creative Teaching Grants. Fourteen teachers submitted requests for funds to purchase innovative items or enrichment materials to enhance their instruction. A selection committee representing the Foundation Board, the FPS administration, and the Fremont Education Association reviewed the applications and selected the following teachers and projects: Mary Robinson, transportation costs for adult mentors for blind students; Tammy Rensch, document camera for 4th grade class; Jamie Navarette, "playaways" audio books for the Middle School library; Dan Bax, video flip camera for 8th grade English; Jenny Paden, video flip camera for Senior High math; and Tara Pugliese, books to assist parents of children who stutter.

The original funding for the Creative Teaching Grants came from the memorial donations in honor of former FHS Principal, Dr. Ken Thomson. As other memorials have been received by the Foundation, they have been added to this fund to assist quality instruction in the Fremont schools. The teachers are extremely grateful for the opportunity to receive money for projects outside the traditional budgets and it is an appropriate way to honor those who dedicated their lives to the teaching profession and the students of Fremont. ★

Tom is interested in the Foundation because "I believe the success of a community begins with success in the classroom. The school system is one of the most important building blocks for a healthy community."

Nick is an attorney with Sidner Law firm, and is a Cedar Bluffs native. Except for a three year period while Brad was in law school, he and his wife Shawn have lived in Fremont since coming to Fremont to attend Midland College. They are the parents of three children including Gentry, a 2008 Fremont High graduate, Ian, a Fremont High junior, and Taryn, a Fremont High freshman. Brad and Shawn feel that their children have received a great education in the Fremont Public Schools, and Brad sees serving on the Foundation Board as "an opportunity to help insure that the Fremont Public Schools remain strong and competitive." ★
