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Academic Achievement Award Honors FHS Scholars

Over 200 students, parents and faculty mentors were in attendance at the Fremont Golf Club Sunday Evening for the Fremont Public School Foundation's 12th annual Academic Achievement Banquet. The event honored members of the Fremont High School Class of 2016 who will graduate cum laude with distinction. This year 41 students qualified for the award, which goes to those who have achieved a 3.75 Grade Point Average over their high school career, and have also taken the top level academic classes.

2004 Fremont graduate, Joslyn Dalton, was the featured speaker. Foundation Executive Director Joe Sajejic, who served as emcee for the event, noted that Joslyn was a very active Fremont High student, as a member of National Honor Society, viola player in the orchestra and as an accomplished runner, winning all class gold medals in state cross country and state track in the 1600, 3200 and as a member of the 4x800 relay. In fact, Joslyn did not lose a race in her senior year! In his introduction, Sajejic also praised Dalton's academic and career achievements. After graduation from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln with a degree in Communications Studies, where she was selected as a captain of the track team, Joslyn pursued her MBA and Master's in Sports Business from the University of Central

Florida in Orlando. During her career, Joslyn has worked for Major League Soccer's Chicago Fire, the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and the NBA's Orlando Magic. The opportunity to help launch ESPNW, ESPN's first business dedicated to female athletes and fans, led Joslyn to Connecticut after college. Within her first year, she was promoted to Chief of Staff for the Senior Vice President over ESPN's website, mobile and magazine businesses. After four years at ESPN, Joslyn became the Vice President for a small content company before channeling everything she had learned along the way into her own business.

In her remarks to students, Dalton referred to her journey from the halls of Fremont High a few short years ago, to her present position as owner of her branding agency, JMar & Co. She pointed out that students will be faced with multiple challenges and fears along their future paths, but to persevere and have courage when facing these obstacles, and not to be afraid of taking measured risks in order to reach their goals. She also noted the powerful influence of the parents and mentors who have helped and guided them to this point in their lives.

Students, mentors and Ms. Dalton were all presented with a graduation gift from the Foundation. ★

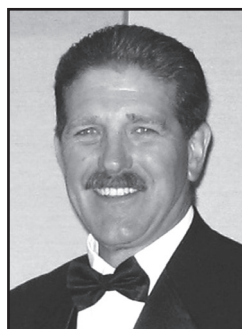

Superintendent's Message

As we begin a new school year we welcome many new staff members, Administrators and support personnel. This past spring and summer the District hired 19 new teachers, three new administrators and many support staff. The positions that were filled are due to retirements and resignations. Many of the new employees are also new to Fremont and will become members of our community.

Scott Jensen, Fremont Middle School Principal, has been hired to replace Gale Hamilton as the Executive Director of Secondary Administration. Gale retires after serving the community in various administrative capacities for the past 26 years. His leadership will be greatly missed.

LaVonna Emanuel has been hired to replace Scott Jensen at the middle school. She comes to the District and community from Sioux Falls South Dakota where she has served for the past 10 years as an administrator at the middle school level. LaVonna served Fremont Public Schools as an English teacher at the high school prior to leaving for an administrative post in the Lincoln Public School system.

Chris Raasch has been hired to replace Allison Kelberlau as the Principal at Bell Field Elementary. Chris joins the District after serving the Lincoln Public Schools as a teacher and administrator for the past 7 years. Chris grew up in Fremont and is a 1999 graduate of Fremont High School.

Joel Kerkman has been hired as the Director of Special Education. This is a newly formed position funded primarily with State and Federal funds. Joel will oversee the Special Education department and provide leadership in serving our students with special needs. Joel and his wife Becky Turner (a school psychologist) have served the Fremont Public Schools for the past 14 years.

We are excited to have these individuals and their families join our school district and community.

Each year the Fremont Public School Foundation supports our staff and programs. Without this continual support we would not be able to continue the excellent educational programming and array of extracurricular activities. At Fremont Public Schools we deliver a "Class A" program with attention given to each and every student - the Fremont Public School Foundation is a large part of supporting what we do "WE EDUCATE!" ★

2016 Foundation Awards Creative Teaching Grants

The Creative Teaching Grant Program, initiated in 2009-10, annually makes grants in the amount of \$500 to teachers. The purpose of this grant is to allow teachers to create, design, or implement programs that promote student achievement, enhance the learning environment, or provide opportunities beyond the traditional classroom setting. The grant money may be applied to materials, training, equipment or special programs. With this year's grants, \$38,750 has been directed back to classrooms and educators.

The FPS Foundation, once again, honored creative teaching and innovative strategies of numerous faculty members in the district. With nearly 30 applications, the grants were distributed to 21 teachers representing elementary, middle and high school programs.

Four elementary teachers –Jody Sheppard, Heather Millard, Shelly Caskey and Sharla Schreiber – requested some creative math activities to assist their students with remediation and acceleration in that area. Ben Adler and Kady Maresh were both awarded money to purchase LEGO Mindstorm, a robotics kit that students use to build and program robots as an introduction to robotics. Alison Zuch, Elementary Music teacher, will use her grant to purchase additional electronic keyboards for her classroom providing students the opportunity to learn music through the interactive playing of an instrument. Dana Schipporeit, Media Specialist, requested and received funding to purchase a 3D printer for Milliken Park, and three Special Education/Reading teachers, Chris Ondracek, Mandy Lackey and Jennifer Stevens received funds for purchasing the Leveled Literacy Pack and hands on materials and workboxes for their classes.

High school reading teacher Laura Enos was awarded funding for the purchase of CD players and headsets for the computer-assisted reading program. Sadie Voss, FHS Math teacher, received funds to purchase a document presenter, which is an extremely versatile teaching tool, to assist her instruction.

Finally, the Middle School received several grant awards. English teachers Chris Ronan and Cassandra Schroeder will use their funding for sessions provided through the Nebraska Writers Collective workshop for all 7th grade students. This program will be utilized to assist students in improving their writing skills and fostering creativity by connecting them with professional writers. Shelby Olson and Heidi Melcher, 8th grade English and Special Education instructors respectively, requested and were awarded funding for book creations and plan to share these with the elementary schools.



As always, the FPS Foundation is proud of the quality of our teaching staff and their commitment to professional development, creativity and innovation, and the focus on improving student performance. The Foundation Board thanks everyone who remembers the Foundation with their memorial funds so that we can continue to fund these grant programs. ★

Simulator Enhances Traditional Welding Training

The simulator, a computer-based training system, is an educational tool designed to supplement and enhance traditional welding training. It allows students to practice their welding technique in a simulated and immersive environment, promoting the efficient transfer of quality welding skills while reducing material waste associated with traditional welding training. ★

Fremont Public Schools Gain District Accreditation

Fremont Public Schools achieved the distinction of District Accreditation this past April, pending final approval by AdvancED an organization created through a merger of North Central Association (NCA) and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) and further expanded in 2011 by the acquisition of the Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWAC).

Fremont, in 2006, was the first district in Nebraska to receive "district accreditation." This status indicates that the school has developed a systemic approach to school improvement. Systemic, meaning each building faculty has a connection with and a plan in place for improving student achievement as outlined by established Board Goals. A review team consisting of six individuals from three different states spent three days reviewing numerous artifacts, interviewing nearly two hundred individuals including parents and community members as well as building and district administration. Following these three days the AdvancED team rates the district on five standards ranging from Leadership and Governance to Using Results for Continuous Improvement.

There are 32,000 institutions in the AdvancED network, Fremont was found to be above average in overall score on Index of Educational Quality, a performance standard established by review of teaching and learning that is taking place, leadership within the schools and resources available to meet student and institutional needs. Gale Hamilton, Executive Director of Development and Secondary Operations for FPS in a report to the Board of Education stated, "The IEQ report lists Fremont Public Schools as above average in a group of schools that are above average." He further stated "It is a testament to our teachers and building administrators who continue to make Fremont a great place for students to learn."

Superintendent of schools, Mark Shepard pointed out that the Board of Education at Fremont established goals in 2014-15 that are specific, measureable and time sensitive. These goals have been implemented in each building, "From the teachers, building administrators, support staff workers to the bus drivers and cafeteria workers, all of them are to be commended for their hard work and dedication to student achievement." Shepard said. The report from AdvancED affirmed in their report that our entire district is working together for the best interest and success of each of our students.

At Fremont Public Schools, We Educate. ★

This past year, the Fremont Middle School Industrial Technology Program was awarded a grant from the Big Red Keno Science and Math Grant Program to purchase a set of 3D printers for their classrooms. These grant funds were received on behalf of FMS at the Fremont Public Schools Foundation, which in turn, paid for the printers. With this grant, students will be able to design and produce a wide variety of products using the 3D printing systems and will train every FMS student on those operations. ★

He was also a key player in the passage of the bond issue which created the Splash Station Water Park.

Jim was a member of the FPS Foundation Board of Directors, and even in his years of declining health, he supported and played in this event, as he loved the game of golf. Naming the tournament in his honor is intended to provide a lasting tribute to Jim, whose hard work and dedication to his community has provided facilities for generations of Fremont youth yet to come.

The event will be a four-person scramble, and includes a meal, complimentary drinks, pin prizes and much more. The price is \$125 per player (\$85 for FGC members).
