## iPad Donor Funds in Action

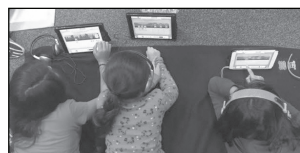
"An iPad in every classroom." It was a wish that became a reality due to the generous donations to the iGive for iPads campaign. The fund raising was promoted as a "game changer," and it has made a huge impact in elementary classrooms. It started as a small pilot program in 6 classrooms, 1st grade at Linden and 4th at Bell Field, and has now grown into multiple iPad carts in all elementary buildings throughout the district.

In 2014, the Fremont Public School Foundation assisted in raising over \$250,000 to provide iPads to every elementary school in the Fremont district. In 2015, another \$18,000 was raised and donated to provide various learning based applications to run on those machines.

It was the hope and plan for teachers to use these iPads in multiple ways, such as supporting struggling students, enhancing students who are excelling, encouraging creativity, and using the district's current curriculum and textbooks online. Today, that is a reality. Students use iPads every day in classrooms all across the district. iPads are an alternate way to engage students in learning other than worksheets. One bonus the iPads have is instant feedback. If a student gets a problem wrong, they are directed to try again. On a worksheet, students are given feedback later that day or the following day once a teacher has had a chance to check the paper.

The iPads themselves are useful, but it is the applications or apps that make the most difference. Teachers are able to request apps to be put on certain iPads.

The iPads can have math apps such as Math Bingo, language arts apps like Teach Me, and creative apps like iMovie. The other great thing about the iPads is that there are constantly new apps being created that support student growth and creativity.



The following comments are from teachers using the iPads. These comments indicate the technology is being used daily and in a variety of meaningful ways.

"We have so appreciated the iPads at our school. They have been a wonderful tool to utilize in enhancing education in the classroom! They allow learners to be even more engaged in their independent learning and the technology experience will benefit them immensely in their future. The use of the iPads allows me to differentiate instruction, challenging my higher ability students as well as providing support for my students struggling in a certain area. They help me reach students with different learning styles, motivate students and gets them excited about different subject areas and provide additional practice and exposure to many skills."

"I use the iPads every day. In math, they are used for math applications and games that match our current topic. Students also work on Pearson's website during math time, as well as using them for our math review. I also use some awesome writing applications to practice writing words.



letters and sentences. We use them during intervention for Moby Max reading, Lexia, and for reading comprehension and listen to reading skills and my class loves this and are engaged in what they are doing. We use them in reading for students to access books online or through QR codes I have found or created."

FPS teachers are currently learning the importance of student engagement. While teachers learn how to engage their students in various ways of instruction, iPads are one way to ensure student engagement in the area of skills practice. The teachers in the district are grateful for the generosity of the FPS Foundation for the iPads and look forward to seeing what can be done for students in the future. ★

These two words and their accompanying definitions sum up the relationship between the Fremont Public School District and the Fremont Public School Foundation. In 2003 the Fremont Board of Education, the leadership of the school district, and several local community leaders came together to form the Fremont Public School Foundation. Unlike many of their counterparts across the State, this foundation was not founded based on a large gift but rather as a tool the community and school district could use to serve as a conduit to support pre-K through 12 public education in Fremont through private donations.

The State of Nebraska funding formula takes into account locally provided funds. This component of State Aid actually reduces dollar for dollar the State's support for a school district's any privately donated funds. By utilizing the Foundation these dollars can be targeted to specific programs and not have reducing effects on the school district's revenues.

The common benefit that Webster refers to and the mutual reliance in the definitions above are brought together through the commissioning of both organizations vision and mission statements with the benefactors being the students and programs of the school district. There are many examples of this cooperative effort between the school district and the foundation.

For many years the Foundation has hosted an annual academic achievement awards banquet, recognizing our highest achieving students, their parents and the teacher that has made a significant contribution to their success. The Foundation, in cooperation with the School District, has helped raise funds for special projects including equipping every Fremont elementary building with iPads to aid in carrying out the curriculum and bolster our students achievement in the areas of math and reading.

The Foundation has supported our current "We Educate" campaign by sponsoring our semimonthly radio talk show on KHUB and the recent billboards you may have noticed in the community. Both of these venues are designed to highlight the successes of our students and programs.

Through the efforts of the Foundation and the use of "Creative Teaching Grants" many classroom needs have been met with the use of private donations and fundraising facilitated by the Foundation.

This winter the Foundation Board announced the development of a new grant funding program known as "Making a Difference" grants. This online process will allow teachers and staff members to outline a project and the financial needs associated with it and then offer the opportunity for donations to be received in part or total to support the initiative. This exciting program will be available this spring on the FPS Foundation website at <http://www.fpsfoundation.com>. The Foundation is a 501c.3 organization and most donations are tax deductible. Please consult your tax professional.

Working directly with the Foundation affords the school district the opportunity to further our mission and provide the best possible opportunities for our students and families!

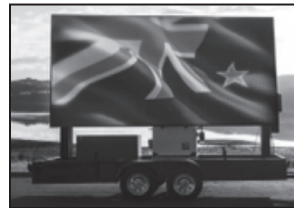
## Fremont High School Track Renovation

The FHS Track and Field and Cross Country Programs have been sources of pride within the school district and the community. Last spring, FPS began a renovation project with resurfacing the ten-year old track surface. Constant pounding and Nebraska weather conditions caused the surface to harden and break down, and athletes were starting to see adverse effects including shin splints, stress fractures, knee pain, and foot problems. Fremont Public Schools completed resurfacing the track last June.



Appleget Field Resurfaced Track & High Jump Area Expansion

Along with the resurfacing project, the coaching staff and some community members developed a multifaceted plan to complete other much needed upgrades to Appleget Field. A collaborative effort was launched by coaches, community volunteers, Fremont Public Schools, and the FPS Foundation. The high jump area did not meet National Federation standards for size and too much slope. The high jump area was expanded and resurfaced by FPS and community donations received through the FPS Foundation. Data cabling and conduit to locations around the track to connect cameras used to record finishes at track meets was completed by FPS last October. FHS students enrolled in Information Technology (IT) class gained real-world application skills by working with an installation professional and the FPS technology team to complete the actual installation.



Mobile Display Board

With track resurfacing, high jump area expansion, and data cabling complete, funds are being raised for additional pieces. Currently, competitors, coaches and fans wait for meet results to be posted by hand. By purchasing a mobile digital display board, athletes, coaches, and fans will be kept up-to-date during track meets and cross country meets. Competitors in each event, real time results of each event, and team scoring will be displayed immediately. The digital display board will brand the Tigers' home meet atmosphere and build a unique fan experience that will generate school and community pride. In addition, the Appleget Field sound system which is used for track meets, football games, elementary track and field day, and other events needs to be replaced. The current system is at least 30 years old and is not designed for hundreds of people gathered within the outdoor stadium setting where vocal clarity and coverage are essential. Additional funds will also be used to upgrade the shot put and discus areas and remove and replace dead trees that were originally planted in memory of Coach Larry Sheppard.

To date, \$59,300 has been raised through the the FPS Foundation including \$37,650 from businesses/organizations, \$10,000 from FHS student-athletes, and \$11,650 from families/individual donors. Of that \$59,300, the amount of \$45,740 has gone toward the high jump area expansion. To complete the entire project, donations of \$38,908 are being sought. All donors will be recognized on signs at the Appleget Track and Field entrances. Names of contributors will also run across the digital display board during track meets and cross country meets and will be noted in programs distributed at track meets. An ad recognizing donors will also be placed in the Fremont Tribune. Donors will be recognized according to the following levels:

teaching grants to 21 FPS teachers. In addition, we hosted our certified FPS teaching staff and administrators at the building level for ice cream sundae events, encouraging them to support our Foundation through monthly payroll deductions. As a result, over 35% of our staff are now regular contributors to the Foundation, and we hope to grow that percentage in the years to come.

The Foundation also recently established a Dual Credit Tuition Assistance fund from which our Foundation, using an application process, will assist Fremont High School students with paying for tuition for dual credit classes. It is our hope that every student who graduates will have college credits they can readily transfer to two-year or four-year post-secondary institutions. We believe the Foundation's financial support can help make this a reality. This fund was augmented by a generous contribution from the Fremont Area Community Foundation, and we thank them for supporting our vision.

## Long-time Educators Noted in Passing

Several retired Fremont Public Schools teachers have recently passed away.

Mildred C. (Millie) Beran, 67, passed away on Monday, July 4, 2016 at her home. Millie graduated from Howells High School and attended Wayne State College and then graduated from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln with a Bachelor's degree in teaching. She taught Family and Consumer Science in Arkansas, California, Cedar Bluffs, Omaha North and finished her teaching career at Fremont High School, retiring in 2015.

Alice Wayne Johnson, 76, passed away on Sunday, July 24, 2016. Alice graduated from Bethany College with a degree in Music Education. She taught for 38 years in Kansas and Nebraska and began teaching in the Fremont system in 1973. Shortly thereafter, Alice founded the Fremont Orchestra Program. She retired from FPS in 1998 and touched the lives of hundreds of music students during her career.

Patrick H. Murphy, 79, died Saturday, October 22, 2016. Pat graduated from Midland College in 1965 with a Bachelor of Science degree. He continued his education, attending the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and earning a Master's degree in Educational Administration and Physical Education and a Specialist degree in Educational Administration and Supervision. Pat spent his entire career with the Fremont Public Schools, teaching at the elementary to start and finished his teaching career at the secondary level. Pat also coached football and track for over 30 years, retiring in 1997. Pat's entire obituary is included in the Tiger Tracks portion of this edition.

D. Joan "Jody" Draemel, 94, passed away on Saturday, November 12, 2016. Jody graduated from Fremont High and then from Midland College with a degree in Elementary Education. She taught in the Fremont elementary school system from 1955 through 1982. Jody was the wife of My Draemel, who was a teacher and coach at Fremont High and then at Midland College.

Memorials to the Fremont Public School Foundation, including those, in the names of educators, are placed into the Creative Teaching Grant fund. The purpose of these grants is to allow teachers to create, design, or implement programs that promote student achievement, enhance the learning environment, or provide opportunities beyond the traditional classroom setting. Grants are awarded annually through an application and selection committee process. Since the inception of these grants in 2009-10, over \$38,000 has been directed back to classrooms and educators thanks to the generosity of our donors through these memorials. ★

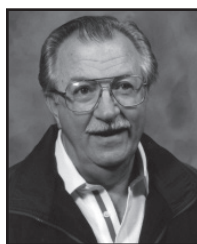

Patrick H. Murphy, age 79, died Saturday, October 22, 2016, at Dunklau Gardens in Fremont. Pat was born and raised in Des Moines, Iowa, where he graduated from East High School. He earned an Associate of General Studies degree at Central College in McPherson, Kansas, in 1959 and a Bachelor of Science degree from Midland College in 1965. He attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, earning a Master's degree in Educational Administration and a Specialist degree in Educational Administration and Supervision (1972).

Pat began his career teaching sixth grade at Linden Elementary for five years where his athletic teams were legendary. From 1965-1997, Pat taught social studies and coached football and track at Fremont High School. In 1979-80, he was an assistant coach for the men's track team at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. His commitment to the jump events and his desire to perfect technique in his athletes earned him a reputation as one of the most successful and innovative coaches in Nebraska track history. His records are remarkable as he coached 138 athletes at the State Meet in his four events, winning the pole vault five times, the triple jump three times, and the high jump five times. He had 31 conference champions, 43 district champions, and 13 state champions.

Pat was a master teacher in the classroom, initiating courses in black history, the World Wars, and several other topics. His creative use of original overheads connected students visually with history before the advent of current technology. His teaching prowess made him an excellent and in-demand presenter at clinics and conferences across the country, sharing his coaching techniques and strategies from Pennsylvania to Colorado. In addition, he was an instructor at both Husker and Kearney State Track Camps and a field judge for National Junior Olympic, AAU, and TAC meets throughout the state.

Recognition by his peers resulted in his selection as the first Assistant Coach of the Year and as a recipient of the Binnie and Dutch track award from the Nebraska Coaches' Association. His most recent honor was having the Fremont Invitational Track Meet renamed in his honor and the establishment of the Pat Murphy Track Scholarship. For all of his accomplishments, he was proudest of the outstanding young men and women that were his athletes and their continued friendship was a highlight of his life.

Pat was preceded in death by his parents Allie (Balch) and Henry Clay Murphy, as well as his sister Carol Zeiger, father-in-law Art Peterson, and granddaughter Keely Murphy.

Pat is survived by his wife Pam; his daughter Karla Murphy of Phoenix, AZ; his sons Patrick Murphy Jr. of Millard and Sean (Courtney) Murphy of Fremont. Grandchildren are Jordan Murphy, Cole Murphy, McKenna Murphy, Kellen Murphy and Calihan Murphy. He is also survived by his mother-in-law Lois Anderson; sisters-in-law Keri Emery and Suzy (Paula) Anderson; brothers-in-law Michael (Tammy) Peterson and Craig Emery, and many nieces and nephews.
