

Making A Difference brings crowd funding opportunities to the Fremont Public Schools

The Fremont Public School Foundation has launched a new crowd funding platform that allows the Foundation to launch campaigns to support specific needs for district organizations, groups and departments. Known as **Making a Difference**, the site is similar to other crowd funding platforms such as GoFundMe or Kickstarter, where donors have the ability to discover, share and donate to causes directly while campaign progress is updated in real-time.

Making a Difference is located on the FPS Foundation website at <http://fpsfoundation.com/fps-campaigns> and launched with campaigns featuring several worthy projects.

"**Making a Difference** is a great way for those interested in specific projects to build support through social media and encourage giving to something they are passionate about," said Joe Sajevic, Executive Director of the Fremont Public School Foundation. "It also allows donors who support these campaigns to make contributions without transaction fees, while taking advantage of the tax deduction associated with charitable giving to the Fremont Public School Foundation."

Initial projects in **Making a Difference** include:

Nebraska Writer's Collective Poetry Workshop — Fremont Middle School 7th Graders will interact with professional "slam poets" from the Nebraska Writer's Collective for a full day of poetry writing and performance workshops.

Rock my Stress Away — Funds raised will help purchase rocking chairs and desks for an 8th Grade Math classroom at the Fremont Middle School. Research has shown this type of furniture can reduce stress for students and improve learning as a result.

Meeting the Sensory Needs for Kindergarten Students - The purpose of this request is to help meet the sensory needs of kindergarten students. The request would fund the purchase of 6 wobble chairs for "wiggly" kindergartners. Research has shown that increased physical activity during the school day can help children's attention, classroom behavior, and achievement test scores.

FHS College Visitation for 9th and 10th grade students — Each year, the Fremont Senior High Guidance Department sponsors trips to college campuses (Wayne State College or UNL) for FHS Freshmen and sophomore students. The goal of these trips is to expose FHS students to the college experience, which hopefully increases the enrollment of our students in a college.

Lakeshore Reading skills Folder Game Libraries - These reading skills folder games will provide a fun and engaging way to practice different literacy skills, including vocabulary, phonological awareness, phonics and word recognition.

MyStep Pedometers — Providing students with fitness data is important. The pedometers will provide students with instant fitness data that will elevate their performance and health. These pedometers will be utilized throughout the FHS PE Department.

English Language Arts Activities for Kindergarten students at Milliken Park – Materials purchase will enhance teaching and learning in phonics, phoenemic awareness, blending and segmenting, word work, word building and reading skills.

Superintendent's Message

I ♥ PUBLIC SCHOOLS -

I ♥ FREMONT PUBLIC SCHOOLS

You may have seen the T-shirts or the billboards related to I ♥ Public Schools. This campaign, supported by the Sherwood Foundation in support of public schools in Nebraska, has a far reaching impact.

Did you know that public schools in Nebraska educate 357,000 students annually? Instruction is delivered daily by 26,139 certificated teachers in 245 public school districts. In Fremont alone we educate nearly 4,800 preschool through grade 12 students on a daily basis.

Did you know that Nebraska ranks 10th in the nation for ACT scores with a statewide score just under 22? Fremont High School students receive test preparation presented by John Baylor, CEO of On To College, during the first semester of their junior year and have access to On To College online resources as well at no charge. This past Spring the Board of Education recognized 41 students for achieving a 25 or higher on the ACT.

Did you know that Fremont Public Schools graduates 350 students on an annual basis and that FHS averages 13 University of Nebraska Board of Regents scholars annually? The graduating class of 2017 had 104 students receive academic scholarships totalling more than \$4.5 million!

Did you know that Fremont High School partners with Midland University, Metropolitan Community College and the University of Iowa to provide students with the opportunity to complete dual credit courses while completing high school graduation requirements? A student can complete in excess of a full semester of college credit saving them and their family future expense. The Fremont Public School Foundation has granted in excess of \$5,000 in tuition assistance and books to over 25 students to ensure that they have access to these valuable programs.

Did you know that Fremont High School, within their dual credit programs, partner with local businesses to provide on-the-job training and real life experiences in the areas of welding, health occupations, diesel tech, general education and computer sciences. These partnerships provide access to our students to prospective future employers and positions them well as they make career choices.

Did you know that Fremont Public Schools has 125 business partners working with principals, teachers, support staff and PTA's to provide opportunities for students that would not be available through the limited District budget? These partnerships are crucial in the educational process.

Did you know that Fremont Public Schools partners with the City of Fremont, the YMCA, United Way, Care Corp, the Salvation Army, the Hope Center, the Presbyterian Church and many social organizations to support the educational process and look out for the well-being of the families of our community?

Did you know that Fremont Public Schools partners with our private and parochial schools - Archbishop Bergan and Trinity to provide special education and reading support as well as textbooks? FHS also co-ops sports teams with Archbishop Bergan in swimming, softball, tennis and baseball.

FPS and the impact of our programs, like the I ♥ PUBLIC SCHOOLS campaign, have a far reaching effect - **What's not to about FREMONT PUBLIC SCHOOLS?**

Qball Throwable Wireless Microphone for Kindergarten students at Milliken Park – Use of the Qball increases engagement of the entire class by taking turns sharing answers in addition to amplifying the responses of the quiet, shy students.

Kindergarten Math Activities for Milliken Park – These materials will provide hands-on learning activities such as manipulation and allow for differentiation of learning to take place.

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) kits for Kindergarten students at Milliken Park – These activities will provide student-centered, experimental, fun and engaging opportunities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math.

Updated Equipment for Tiger Marching Band – While working towards making the Tiger Marching Band a competitive traveling unit again, they are in need of several major pieces of equipment to allow this to happen.

Fremont Public Schools Foundation Wins Grant from CF Industries

In November, CF Industries ran their "Millionth Classroom Mini-grant Dollar Contest", celebrating the program's milestone of one million dollars contributed to local classrooms.

"We're celebrating both the Classroom Mini-grant Program's millionth dollar donated and the incredible ways our teachers use the mini-grants to give students a unique learning experience," said Daniel Whitney, Superintendent of CF Industries' Fremont Terminal.

"Helping local teachers bring new and exciting opportunities focused on agriculture and the environment to the classroom has been one of our best investments."

The contest was based on the number of votes each school district received on the CFI Website from November 1 through November 15. There were 5 grants awarded, and the FPS Foundation placed third in the voting and received a \$1,250 mini-grant.

The money was placed into the Creative Teaching Grant account at the Fremont Public School Foundation and will be designated for class projects that incorporate agriculture or the environment into the classroom, with priority placed on projects that focus on water quality, per CFI's requirements.

Dual Credit Financial Assistance is Up and Running!

The Foundation recently began awarding monetary assistance to Fremont Senior High students through a fund established with monies raised from our November 2016 Tail Gate event and the Fremont Area "Big Give" held in May 2017.

Through an application process, this assistance helps qualified Fremont High School students by paying for tuition, books and equipment for dual credit classes. So far, we've assisted over 30 students for a total of over \$5,000 in aid for the second semester alone!

Cynthia Kostek, FHS Guidance Counselor says: "The Foundation's Dual Credit Assistance program has allowed a number of our high school students to earn college credits who would not have been able to afford this opportunity even with the discounted tuition. We are very grateful that the foundation has seen the value in the dual credit opportunity and is willing to fund or students." Mark Williams, FHS Guidance Chair adds: "This is a great opportunity for our students and the generosity of our foundation is giving students a head start on a college education. This can have life altering changes for our students and we are blessed to have this support from the Foundation. "

It remains our goal that every student who graduates will have college credits they can readily transfer to two-year or four-year post-secondary institutions. This fund was augmented this year by generous grants from the First National Bank Fremont and the Lester A. Walker Foundation, and we thank them for supporting our vision.

Foundation Receives Gift to Purchase Innovative Football Helmets

The Fremont Public Schools Foundation recently received an anonymous donation of over \$52,000 to cover the cost of purchasing 130 concussion-alert Riddell InSite Football helmets for the Fremont Senior High 9-12 football program.

These helmets have an impact monitoring system technology that monitors and records impact to individual helmets and alerts coaches and trainers when a significant impact, or a series of impacts, may result in a concussion during practice or games.

Upon receiving this alert, coaches and trainers remove the player from participation and run a series of concussion protocol tests to assess the player. If the player shows any of the symptoms of a concussion, he is not allowed to continue participation and is examined by a medical doctor for treatment.

Although no helmet can completely prevent head or neck injuries, this technology will serve to keep our players as safe as possible when playing and practicing.

FHS is the only school outside of the OPS schools and Creighton Prep to have this technology available to them, Thanks to this very generous donation, FHS is the only school outside of the OPS system and Creighton Prep to have this technology available.

Martin H. Trautrimas Ph.D.
April 17, 1936 - January 7, 2018

Martin H. Trautrimas, age 81, of Fremont, passed away Sunday, January 7, 2018, at UNMC in Omaha surrounded by family.

Martin was born on April 17, 1936, in Švikšna, Lithuania, to Andrius and Auguste (Kleinas) Trautrimas. His first five years were spent on

the family farm before they were forced to flee westward and spend the next ten years as displaced persons in war-torn Europe. When he was 15, his family came to the U.S. and lived on the Leonard Hoegemeyer farm in Scribner, Nebraska, where he attended high school before the family's move to Omaha. He graduated from Omaha South High School in 1953.

His lifelong commitment and service to education began with his graduation from the University of Omaha (now UNO) in 1958 with a Bachelor of Arts in German and Spanish with a minor in history and a secondary teaching certificate. His quest for knowledge continued with his earning a Master of Arts in Spanish Literature in 1963 from the University of Wisconsin, Madison; and a Ph.D. en Letras Castellanas in 1969 from the Universidad Jaime Balmes, Guadalajara, Mexico. Over the years, he received many grants and honors for further continuing his studies.

His professional career began with his teaching both German and Spanish in the Fremont Public Schools from 1958-1964 and then as a professor of languages and humanities at Midland Lutheran College (now Midland University) until his retirement in 2000. Even in "retirement" he continued to teach English as a Second Language in diverse settings in Fremont

While expanding his knowledge of languages, in 1960 he met Patricia (Pat) Van Voorhis in a Russian class at the University of Omaha. They began their lifelong partnership with their marriage June 9, 1962. Their love produced their beloved children, son Marc David Trautrimas and daughter Michelle Marie Trautrimas Wood.

Part of his commitment to education was his desire to broaden the horizons of his students, not only by their gaining knowledge of another language, but also of other cultures, and how better than to experience the rest of the world first-hand. He and Pat led their first international study-tour in 1964, and over the years Martin sponsored more than 30 such study-tours to Europe, Mexico and Guatemala, the Holy Land, and Asia. He also helped to sponsor other international experiences through his work with Rotary International of which he was a member since 1982.

Central to Martin's life was his strong faith. He was an active member of First Lutheran Church since 1958 and also a member of the Executive Committee of the Lithuanian Lutheran Church in Exile. His talents enabled him to be a particularly productive participant in several missionary trips into Mexico. Studies at the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago and at Creighton University led to a Diploma in Ministry in 1987 from Creighton University, Omaha.

He was preceded in death by his parents; Sisters Olga (who died in infancy), Marta Sarka, and Ruta Kallio; and parents-in-law, Myron and Mildred Van Voorhis.
