

a very caring and generous community!

The Fremont Public School Foundation was an active participant again this year and we are proud to have received almost \$13,000 from 123 individual donors! The Foundation won an extra \$1,000 for having the most "Prescheduled Gifts" (those donations given prior to the start of the actual "Big Give" campaign at 12:01 AM on the 4th).

These generous donations will be placed into the "Dual Credit Assistance" fund at the FPS Foundation, which helps students take Dual Credit classes through Metro, Midland, or other post-secondary institutions. With the amount raised, we should be able to assist quite a few students next year!!

Dan passed away in the arms of his wife Heidi and surrounded by his family on April 18. The entire Fremont Public School Foundation Board extends our thoughts and prayers to Dan's family.

A History of Helping Deserving Students

This year marks the 22nd year that the Alumni Student Aid Fund has provided financial assistance to deserving Fremont High School Graduates. Originally established by Fremont High School alumni from the class of 1948, and headed up for many years by David Christensen, the Alumni Student Aid Fund continues to make it possible for qualified Fremont High School graduates to pursue higher education having awarded approximately \$90,000 since its inception.

This year the Fund awarded a total of \$3,500 in scholarships to Annie Cooper, a 2019 graduate, and Shane Miller, a 2021 graduate.

The program funds are now managed by the Fremont Area Community Foundation, and gifts to the program can be made directly to the Community Foundation or to the Fremont Public School Foundation which forwards all scholarship donations to the Community Foundation. Those wishing to donate to the scholarship program can use the enclosed gift envelope, and designate the portion of the gift they wish to be placed in the scholarship fund.

Fremont Public Schools Foundation Awards Creative Teaching Grants for 2021

The FPS Foundation once again honored creative teaching and innovative strategies of faculty members in the district by awarding over \$1,100 in funds for Creative Teaching Grants. Even though COVID reduced the number, several staff applied and the grants were distributed to 3 teachers representing different FPS programming throughout the system.

The Creative Teaching Grant Program, initiated in 2009-10, annually makes grants to allow teachers to create, design, or implement programs that promote student achievement, enhance the learning environment, or provide opportunities beyond the traditional classroom setting. The grant money may be applied to materials, training, equipment or special programs. With this year's grants, over \$61,000 has been directed back to classrooms and educators.



Ashley Mruz, 1st Grade teacher at Bell Field Elementary, requested and received monies to purchase sets of books of the same title from Scholastic meeting the various literary needs of her students. Students will then sign up to read a book that interests them along with 3 to 5 of their classmates. Once they all finished the book, the entire group gets to have lunch with Mrs. Mruz and visit about the book they read.

This is a great way to build relationships and also expose children to different authors and topics.



Darcy Johnson, K-4 Special Education Teacher at Milliken Park Elementary, made a request to purchase Osmo Kits for use with the iPads in her classroom. These award winning kits provide students with fun interactive game activities that are highly engaging while focusing on learning concepts important to the growth of her students. Students use the Osmo Kits for independent work time to enhance and support

the direct instruction they receive throughout the day in areas such as Math and Reading.



Dana Fontaine, Media Specialist at Fremont High School, is using the monies she was awarded to purchase a 3D printer for the FHS Media Center's expanded makerspace! Classroom teachers collaborate with Mrs. Fontaine for class projects such as furniture making to scale in Family and Consumer Science. Individual students can also work with this exciting resource under staff direction to use

their creative talents to make nameplates for their lockers or to replace missing game pieces.

As always, the FPS Foundation is proud of the quality of our teaching staff and their commitment to professional development, creativity and innovation, and the focus on improving student performance. The Foundation Board thanks everyone who remembers the Foundation with their memorial gifts so that we can continue to fund these grant programs.
